Bill Wales, Research Manager, Dairy Production Sciences Agriculture Victoria Research

Ellinbank has a long history of generating research that is used by Australia's dairy farmers; dairy research has been carried out at the site since the 1950s. This has ensured Australia is one of the most efficient dairy producers in the world. How will their current projects deliver improvements to dairy farmers at the farm gate? Research Manager Bill Wales will provide valuable insights into the current projects being undertaken at Ellinbank and the researchers driving them.
